interdisciplinary conference focused on human rights and digital design.

The theme of the conference is to explore the existing and potential ways in which

rules and norms deriving from human rights and human rights law can be

incorporated into the design of digital systems. This theme is not limited to ideas and

measures related to the design phase of digital technologies or proactive regulatory

approaches, but also includes, for example, how human rights can form part of

procedures of oversight and review, the roles of related institutions, the social effects

of particular software or content moderation practices, or the risks of relying on

technical mechanisms for enabling, enforcing, or restricting human rights. Those

interested in participating are welcome to interpret the conference theme broadly. As

one of the aims of the conference is to foster interdisciplinary discussion, authors

need not have a background in law, philosophy, or human rights, but may work in

fields such as computer science, information technology, or public policy.

The co-organisers invite authors to submit an abstract of no more than 300 words

that relates to the conference theme. An author bio of no more than 50 words should

also be included in the same document.

Submissions in either English, Portuguese, or Spanish are welcome, and should be

subject line: "Submission: Embedding Human Rights in Digital Design".

Authors of selected abstracts may be invited at a later date to submit a full paper for

consideration to be published as part of an edited collection.
