Students are required by the Oxford Law Faculty to take the following courses during their abroad:

Law with French Law

Université Panthéon-Assas (Paris II)

In Each Semester

Fundamental Courses: *Droit constitutionnel* (with written exam and *travaux dirigés*)
Droit civil (les obligations) (with written exam and *travaux dirigés*)

Supplementary Courses: Three law courses chosen from subjects of the first year, second year or third year *Licence*, or *Master 1*

In addition, students will take supplementary courses in *droit constitutionnel* and *droit civil* which are designed to give support in learning the techniques required for the study of (and examination in) these subjects.

During the year, students must:

- (a) pass two Klausuren in either public or private law;

AND

- (b) *EITHER*

- (i) write a seminar paper (Seminararbeit). Students must take a seminar as one of your optional courses in order to do this,

OR

- (ii) write the Hausarbeit in at least one of these courses (Grundkurs Zivilrecht or Grundkurs Öffentliches Recht).

Law with European Law

University of Leiden

In each semester courses may be chosen from amongst the Leiden Law Courses subject only to the following restrictions:

- (1) The total ECTS credit value of the courses chosen across the two semesters must amount to a minimum of 60 points. Students are strongly advised to take courses in each semester that deliver a total ECTS credit value of a minimum of 30 points, although requests to take an imbalanced load (e.g. only 25 points in one semester) will be considered.
- (2) Students must take one of the basic courses on EU Law, and preferably in the first semester, in order to give a grounding in EU law which will be useful for the whole year's courses.
- (3) Students may not take any course which is solely concerned with English Law. However, comparative law courses which include elements of English law may be taken.
- (4) No more than a total of 15 ECTS credits may be courses which do not involve substantial study of subjects within one or more of the fields of European law, public or private international law, or Dutch law. This means that courses in ancient law (e.g. Ancient Egyptian Law), or non-European legal systems (e.g. Islamic law; Law and Governance in Africa, Law and Governance in Indonesia), or in areas of law which have no significant European or international dimension (e.g. Criminalistics; Law and Culture), or in Economics or Management rather than law (e.g. Trade and Finance in the Global Economy; Business and Entrepreneurship), may be taken but only within this 15 ECTS credit limit.

Law with Italian Law

Università Degli Studi di Siena

Students must take courses within the Law Faculty totalling at least 42 credits, including:

Diritto Costituzionale (12 credits)

and

Diritto Privato (12 credits).

AND EITHER

1. two 9-credits courses (totalling 42 credits)

OR

2. one course of 9 credits and two 6-credits courses (totalling 45 credits).
